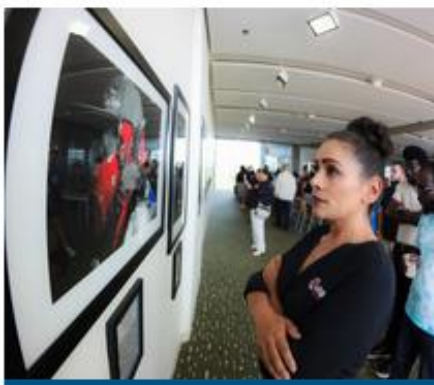
A message from our community
