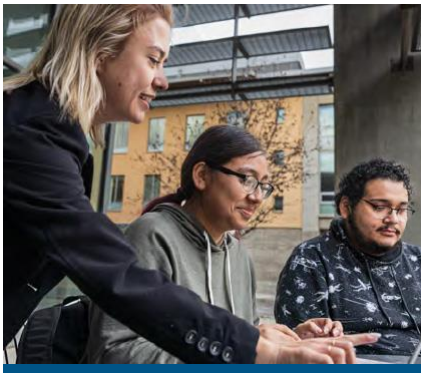


## UC Merced + the Central California Asthma Collaborative = Better Health
